

ENERAL CALL UERTO RICO DEMOCRATIC PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY



Pursuant to the provisions in Sections 8.1.a and 8.6.a of Act 58-2020, as amended, known as the "Puerto Rico Election Code of 2020," hereinafter referred to as the Election Code, and the applicable rules and regulations of the Democratic Party of the United States of America, the Democratic Presidential Primary shall be held on Sunday, April 28, 2024. Voters affiliated with the Democratic Party can vote for their preferred candidate for the nomination of President of the United States of America. When voters vote for a particular presidential candidate, they also vote for the delegates pledged to that candidate if the candidate nominated them. The names of the district delegates nominated by a candidate shall appear in the same column as the candidate. The delegates will be elected based on the proportion of votes cast for the presidential candidate to whom they are pledged.

In this Primary, any voter registered to vote in Puerto Rico in the general elections, in accordance with the Election Code, is affiliated with the Democratic Party, and is 18 years old by the date of the next general election, may vote. At the time of voting, voters must be identified using the mechanisms authorized by Section 5.13 of the Election Code, including the digital voter identification card.

Voting shall be conducted through the open polling system from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. The Puerto Rico State Elections Commission will announce the polling stations and their locations through various media sources at least fifteen (15) days before the Primary. Voters must vote at their assigned polling station in the senatorial district where their name appears on the voting list. During the Primary, any prohibition provided in the Election Code shall apply. However, the ban on the sale of alcoholic beverages provided in Section 12.22 will not apply to the Democratic Presidential Primary since it is not a general election.

The Democratic Presidential Primary will be conducted in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Election Code and the relevant rules and regulations of the Democratic Party of the United States of America. The right of every voter to universal, equal, direct, and free suffrage will be guaranteed at all times. Under Section 5.1 of the Election Code, employers of continuously operating businesses are urged to take the necessary measures to establish shifts that allow their employees to visit the polling stations between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. on the day of the election.
